Articles of Incorporation of
Illinois Soccer Coaches Association

Article 4

The purposes for which the corporation is organized are to operate exclusively for professional association purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(6) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), or the corresponding provision of any future United States internal revenue statute, including, but not by way of limitation, to advance the overall professional interests of soccer coaches, including but not limited to expanding opportunities and seeking improvements in working conditions.

Article 5

(a) The corporation shall have the authority to receive any property, real, personal, or mixed, by gift, devise, bequest, purchase, lease, loan or otherwise, absolutely or in trust, for the foregoing purposes or any of them, and to carry out the directions and exercise the powers contained in any trust or other instrument under which such property may be so received, including without limitation the expenditure of the principal, as well as the income, of any property so received, if authorized or directed in such trust or other instrument; and, if so received without any designation of specific use, to expend the income and principal thereof for any one or more of the foregoing purposes in such manner and amounts and at such time or times as deemed proper by the board of directors of the corporation.

(b) Notwithstanding the foregoing or any other provision of these Articles of Incorporation:

(i) No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, its members, directors, officers or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth above.

(ii) The corporation shall not carry on any activities not permitted to be carried on by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(6) of the Code or the corresponding provision of any future United States internal revenue statute.

(c) In the event of the dissolution of the corporation, the board of directors shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all of the liabilities of the corporation, dispose of all of the remaining assets of the corporation exclusively for the purposes of the corporation in such manner, or to such organization or organizations organized and operated for similar purposes as shall at the time qualify as a tax-exempt organization or organizations under Section 501(c) of the Code or the corresponding

provision of any future United States internal revenue statute, as the board of directors shall determine. Any of such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the court of general jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for the purposes of the corporation in such manner, or to such organization or organizations which are organized and operated for similar purposes and are tax-exempt under Section 501(c) of the Code or the corresponding provision of any future United States internal revenue statute, as said court shall determine.
